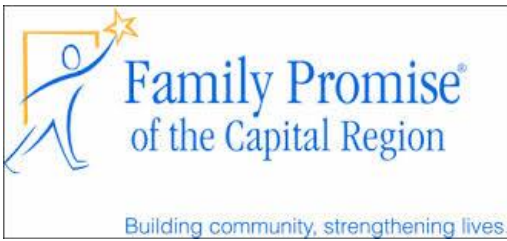

### Rent Moratorium and Relief

We are very busy helping families with the NYS Emergency Rental Assistance Program and anticipate more families needing help with housing as the rent moratorium ends in August.

### Ice-Cream Social

Our ice-cream social was a lot of fun! It was wonderful seeing so many of our volunteers and families there. Each of our six graduates received \$1,100 for their future educational needs. We are so excited for them and their families! Thank you to everyone who contributed to the scholarship fund and/or attended the event!

## Update from PAZAPA

Helping children with special needs in Haiti since 1987

The assassination last month of President Moïse, and the social unrest that has followed, have us particularly worried about the fate of the Republic of Haiti. For now, all is mostly quiet in the city of Jacmel where Pazapa operates. Port au Prince, the capital and center of the current political upheaval, lies fifty miles away over a twisting mountain road.

Pazapa's Executive Director, Marika MacRae, tells us that "Jacmel remains calm. People are venturing outside and going to work today" while she and the school staff are "praying for Peace."

In the more than thirty-five years since Pazapa's founding, the Haitian people have experienced one misfortune after another: coups d'état, hurricanes and of course the 2010 earthquake, from which the damage is still evident almost everywhere you look. Through it all, Pazapa has delivered vital, life-changing services to Haiti's most vulnerable population.

Here we show Pazapa staff member Elise Pierre providing on-going Early Intervention Therapy to Yniacio Baptiste, who is paraplegic.

Pazapa offers special education, medical and therapeutic care to children who are developmentally, physically and/or hearing-disabled. We conduct rural outreach in the communities surrounding Jacmel to bring about greater awareness of our programs and address myths and misconceptions. And we advocate - through both formal and informal channels - on behalf Haiti's disabled



population. That this work has been achieved through multiple cycles of misfortune over the decades is, above all, a tribute to the character and dedication of our staff of teachers, health aides and administrators. Thanks to your help, Pazapa perseveres.
